




Palippothana Megalithic Burial exploration - 2020

The Department of Archaeology and Heritage Management has conducted an extensive exploration at the Palippothana Megalithic burial complex in Kahatagasdigiliya, Anuradhapura during January 2020. Seventy-two burials were recorded from an area of ca. 20,000 sqm. Burials of square and rectangle types, as




Map 1 - Location of Palippothana Megalithic burial complex. Red dots = other megalithic burials in the region, colored regions = river basins

well as menhir type, were recorded. With the Black and Red ware potsherds and fragments of iron objects recovered from the robber pits, the burial complex could relatively assign into 490-350 BC. As the tableland (MSL 161 m) locates in the upper regions of Ma Oya and Malvathu Oya basins, the present study will provide path to understand the colonisation of the river basins during the protohistoric period. The burials hold unique pieces of evidence, and the research team is currently working on further research questions as the funerary rituals, astronomy and the burial architecture, geology of the rock outcrops and the constructions. It hopes the results will provide answer for some complex issues of the protohistoric cultural transitions of the country.

Lower Malwathuoya Basin Archaeology (LMBA) Project: Yodhawewa Archaeological Excavation Conducted by the Department of Archaeology and Heritage Management, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka.

The archaeological study carried out in the first quarter of 2018 at the Yodhawewa area near Mannar has provided many unique facts based on 'Round-bottom extraction furnaces' for the first time in Sri Lanka. More than 3500 wide range of artefacts and naturefacts represented, many types of slags, crucible fragments, various types of grinding stones, Turbinella pyrum sea-shells, local and foreign earthenware, some metal fragments, and wooden charcoal by this premises. The beta-analytic institute of America determined that premises to 1st to 9th centuries AD. In particular, the discovery of carnelian beads, rouletted ware and some of the porcelain in this site indicates that Yodhawewa, not an isolated production centre, and it has long existed as a subproductive place for the international productions near the Mannar port of Sri Lanka. The research and publication committee of the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka contributed financially to the field work and basic analysis of this research. The project Director, Senior Lecturer WMTB Wijepala is carrying out the geological analysis of LMBA project at the Department of Earth science Laboratories of Shimane University, Japan.

Travelling University 2020

This program is a signature seminar course of the International Material Flow Management (IMAT) master degree program offered by the Institute for Applied Material Flow Management (IfaS) of the Trier University of Applied Sciences, Germany. In this seminar course, deploys its expertise in tangible projects that allows the students to put their acquired theoretical knowledge into practice. Having completed projects in over 25 countries on five continents, on its 16th year the TU came back to Sri Lanka for the fourth time. The TU'20was hosted by the Faculty of Technology, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka (RUSL) from **26thFebruary to 5th March**. The focus of TU'20 is to assess the resource and efficiency potentials of the Small & Medium Enterprises (SMEs) in Mihintale.

A team of 22 students from *Germany*, the *USA*, *Japan*, *Vietnam*, *Morocco*, *Nepal*, *Brazil*, *Thailand*, and *Russia*, and another 15 students from RUSL along with expert faculty of IfaS/HT and RUSL to guide them undertook the regional-Material-Flow-Management-based (r-MFM) resource planning for a couple of regional SMEs including MAS Mihintale, Samson Rajarata Tiles.





Twelve Farmer Handbooks to the Community

Farmers have intensified their existing practices and diversified their enterprises in an attempt to meet the changes in the climate, market and other related environmental factors. Having identified the knowledge dissemination gap between the university and the community, the faculty of Agriculture produced twelve handbooks aimed at helping the farmers with technical know-how. The twelve handbooks were produced by the relevant subject matter specialists of the faculty in simple, native language and are full of pictorial illustrations to help the beneficiaries to easily understand the concepts. The books were on micro-irrigation techniques and soil moisture conservation, integrated nutrient management, pest management, mushroom production, commercial floricultural nursery management, maintenance and usage of agro-chemicals, establishment and maintenance of small livestock farms, applied climate smart agricultural practices, low input agriculture, application of traditional techniques in modern farming, sprayer handling and calibration, and agricultural marketing. Publication of the handbooks was funded by the UNESCO participation program.

Telephone Survey Conducted by the World Health Organization on Current COVID-19 Situation in the Country

A survey on perceptions of the current COVID-19 situation and health, social and economic impact of the current scenario among a rural setting in Anuradhapura district was Jointly conducted by Epidemiology unit in Ministry of Health and World Health Organization in May 2020. The telephone interviews were conducted and 46 students from Department of Health promotion were joined as data collectors. The students were trained through Zoom on data collection and entering on the dates of 17th and 19th May 2020 by Dr. Pubudu Chulasiri- Consultant Community Physician (Planning), Office of the Provincial Director of Health Services, Southern Province.

Enterprise Sri Lanka national exhibition -2019

The enterprise Sri Lanka exhibition organized by the Ministry of Finance was held in Jaffna fort from the 07^{th} to the 10^{th} of September in 2019. With the request of presidential task force on drug prevention, students in Department of Health Promotion actively engaged in drug prevention with the community gather round in to exhibition.

Erasmus[†] project - Capacity Building in the Field of Higher Education (CBHE)Curriculum Development in Agroecology/CDAE

The joint proposal submitted by the Department of Agricultural Systems, Faculty of Agriculture, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka collaboration with eight partner universities to Capacity Building in the Field of Higher Education programme of Erasmus⁺ project has been selected by European Commission for implementation in the next three years 2019-2022, and the grant agreement was signed with EU commission. 

Development of a Model Treatment Facility for Remediation of Total Dissolved Solids and Fluoride in Groundwater – A Sustainable Solution for Dry Zone Drinking Water Problems".

A model water treatment plant was designed and constructed for providing safe water to school children at Natiyagma Primary School, Mihintale. In the initial phase, the water treatment plant was housed at the Faculty of Applied Sciences and optimized for the ground water at the Faculty of Applied Sciences and subsequently transferred to school. Now it is fully operated under three channels for drinking, gardening

Daily Mirror Editorial on Health Promotion in a Post-Corona Virus World

The Daily Mirror national newspaper published an editorial on 8th April 2020 recognizing the importance of health promotion in a post-COVID-19 world. The editorial has analyzed the key concepts and strategies likely to be emerged in the global agenda in a post-corona world and detailed the measures to be adopted at both government and community levels. The editorial emphasizes that health promotion is to be a central focus of global development agenda thus making it a mandatory key responsibility of the government and a focus of the communities. The editorial appraises the establishment of the Department of Health Promotion at the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka to support the country's mission in health promotion and recommends an expansion of the department in view of the future demands in the sector. It further proposes the introduction of health promotion as a subject of school curriculum and also stresses the need to encourage more students to pursue higher studies in this field.

Curriculum revision of Department of Health Promotion

In 2019 The Department of Health Promotion has initiated the process of revising the existing curriculum of the B.Sc. (General) degree in Health Promotion and B.Sc. (Special) degree in Health Promotion. The Faculty appointed Prof. Diyanath Samarasinghe, as the consultant of the curriculum revision with a panel of experts in the relevant subject areas. The department adopted a participatory approach inclusive of academic staff, visiting staff, students, alumni, employers and communities to collect data and information for the curriculum revision process.

A WHO funded project was implemented by the Department of Health Promotion in 2019 to enable and empower students to identify and address negative commercial influences on food choices and substance usage. The project aimed at 'empowering students to address commercial determinants of health using health promotion approach. The project was implemented for eight months in eight selected educational institutions in Anuradhapura district.



Training for Development of Innovative Youth Programs on Adolescent and Youth Health

This training programme was conducted by Family Health Bureau, Ministry of Health and Indigenous Medicine was conducted a training programme on development of innovative youth programs on Adolescent and Youth Health in 12th & 26th February and 13th March 2020 at Family Health Bureau. Youth representatives from several institutions in Sri Lanka were participated for the training including five students from Department of Health Promotion. The main objectives of the training were to strengthen available programmes with youth participation and to develop innovative island wide projects to be implemented with the assistance of youth leadership.

Rajarata University International Research Conference

A highlight of the 2019 Faculty of Applied Sciences calendar was the successful completion of the annual University research conference. The Rajarata International Research Conference (RIRC) 2019 commenced on the 6th of November 2019 and drew to a close on the 7th of November 2019. The Faculty of Applied Sciences had the privilege of shouldering the responsibility of organizing the RUSL research conference of 2019. An international conference of multidisciplinary nature, RIRC 2019 drew research from both local and international academic institutions. RIRC 2019 showcased in excess of 200 original works of research spanning from natural sciences to social sciences and humanities. RIRC 2019 carried the theme "Expanding horizons through research, innovation and communication". The overarching aim of RIRC 2019 was to provide a platform for local scholars, industries, students and international participants from a wide range of disciplines ranging from the sciences to humanities, to disseminate their research findings to the general public and academics alike.





The conference week was under-way on the 4th of November with several pre-conference workshops on data sciences and epidemic modelling, conducted by international experts. Inauguration ceremony of RIRC was held on the 6th of November 2019, at the main auditorium of the Faculty of Applied Sciences. Highlights of the inaugural session were the speeches made by distinguished keynote speakers Professor Maithree Wickramasinge (University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka) and Dr. Harshana Liyanage (University of Oxford, UK) and Professor Alun Lloyd (North Carolina University, USA). All sessions of the inaugural day featured oral and poster presentations of Natural Sciences, Technology and Medical and Health Sciences tracks of RIRC 2019. The opening day of RIRC 2019 drew to a close with the official conference dinner held at the Lakeside Nuwarawewa hotel, Anuradhapura.

The second and the final day of RIRC 2019 was opened at the Faculty main auditorium with speeches made by the two distinguished keynote speakers Dr. Herath Manthrithillake (International Water Management Institute, Sri Lanka) and Dr. Dirk Kindermann (University of Vienna). Sessions on the final conference day featured oral and poster presentations from Social Sciences and Humanities and Business and Economics studies. Final session of the day featured a ceremony for distributing certificates and awards for the most outstanding works of research under all disciplines of the conference. With the successful completion of the conference through an excellent concerted effort from the RIRC 2019 organizing committee, Applied Sciences Faculty members and other Faculty coordinators, it marks the high watermark in research dissemination for the Rajarata University Faculty of Applied Sciences.

The 50th World Conference on Lung Health

Two final year (4th year) students (W.G. Nadeesha Seuwandi (2014/2015 batch), W.M. Asinsala Madhumali (2014/2015 batch) and two academic support staff members (S.D.S.R. Karunarathne (Temporary Demonstrator), W.M.N.U.K. Rathnayake (Temporary Demonstrator)) from the Department of Health Promotion were participated and presented abstracts at the 50th Union World Conference on

Lung Health. This conference was held in Hyderabad, India from 30th October to 2nd November 2019 under the theme "Ending the Emergency: Science, Leadership, Action". Two students out of four were selected for students-late breaker session and awarded full scholarships. Including these students, only six students around the world was given these opportunities. All four students from DHP volunteered to support conference organizing committee.



Rajarata University Leptospira isolates are Recognized as the Global Reference Strains

The National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI) Genome database (part of the United States National Library of Medicine [NLM], has listed the *Leptospira interrogates* strain FMAS_AW1, the first complete, circularized genome of *Leptospira* from Sri Lanka as the Reference Genome for *Leptospira interrogates*.

This organism is the most important species causing human leptospirosis, commonly known as "Mee Una" in Sri Lanka. Until April 2020, the reference genome was from China, and the genome was published in the Journal Nature in 2003.

The Leptospirosis research team from the Rajarata University in collaboration with the Yale University researchers published the whole genome sequence in March 2020. Leptospirosis research team of Rajarata University is involved in leptospirosis research since 2009. The ongoing research work on the leptospirosis genome by the team will expand the global understanding on Leptospira and Leptospirosis.











Department of Physiology; First Sri Lankan Department Equipped Impulse Oscillometry

The department of Physiology, Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences, is the first Sri Lankan department to be equipped with a Rs.4.9 mil impulse Oscillometry, courtesy of the Accelerating Higher Education and Development grant. This state-of-the-art lung function assessment system enables assessment of airway resistance and impedance in addition to routine spirometry. This would deliver a hands-on experience on cutting-edge technology in the field of lung function assessment for undergraduate medical students and facilitate novel research on this everexpanding field of research.


Program Review 2020, Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences

The program review, Site Visit was held from 27th to 30th January 2020. The review team reported that our SER was written in the required format and the pieces of evidence were presented with the appropriate labeling. Further, it was reported that the documentary evidence was presented suitably during the site visits. The Faculty has been scored above the weighted minimum score for all the eight criteria and has obtained the overall score of 74.84 with the final grade B for its MBBS program. This indicates that the programs are at a good level of accomplishment but also it requires to be improved to reach an excellent level which the review team felt can be easily achieved by the Faculty. All the staff of the departments (including both academic and non-academic) needs to be commended and congratulated for their commitment to maintaining high quality and standards of the MBBS program.

Professorship

Dr. Anjana Silva (MBBS, M.Phil, PhD (Monash), FRSPH (UK)), Senior lecturer and Head of the Department of Parasitology was promoted as Professor in Parasitology with effect from February 2019. Prof. Anjana Silva joined the Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences in October 2008 as a Lecturer (Probationary) in Parasitology. Being trained as a medical doctor in Sri Lanka, Prof. Silva witnessed the enormous suffering associated with snakebite. With his backgrounds in herpetology and medicine, he developed a passion in researching on snakebite. Over the last decade, Prof. Silva investigates the pathophysiology of snake envenoming and the role of antivenom as treatment, combining clinical studies, classical experimental and molecular pharmacological studies. He has published over 40 research papers in reputed journals and also delivered invited talks and key-note addresses in several international conferences. He recently delivered three prestigious orations based on his contributions for clinical toxinology, herpetology and ichthyology. Prof. Silva has won several



local and international awards in recognition of his work including the 'young scientist in the field of biology', by The World Academy of Sciences and the National Science Foundation, best oral presentation awards at all three major global clinical toxicology conferences (European, North American and Asia-Pacific), and Sri Lankan Presidential awards. He is currently serving as an Adjunct Senior Research Fellow of Monash Venom Group, Monash University, Australia.

ECLIPSE (Empowering Cutaneous Leishmaniasis Patients: an Intervention Programme to Reduce Time to Treatment and Stigma via Community Education).

Rajarata University of Sri Lanka has been awarded a prestigious UK, NIHR competitive research grant of £874,102, one of the largest competitive international research grants ever received by Sri Lankan universities.

The aims of this project are to improve the patient journey for people living with cutaneous leishmaniasis and empower communities to deal with the devastating effects of stigma that it causes. The ECLIPSE is a multi country (UK, Brazil, Ethiopia) collaborative project and the Department of Community Medicine, Faculty of Medicine & Allied Sciences, Rajarata University will be leading the project, while the University of Colombo and the Provincial



Ministry of Health are also partners. Academics from the Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences, trainees and supervisors from the Faculty of Social Sciences and the faculty of Applied Sciences are also involved in this project. Extensive capacity building and training opportunities will be available for RUSL within this project.

Dr. S. Ramachandran Memorial Oration 2019: Delivered at the 132nd Anniversary International Medical Congress of the Sri Lanka Medical Association (SLMA) on 26th July 2019, Colombo, Sri Lanka. *The title of the oration was "Diagnosis of tropical infections: beyond the borders"*.

Anuradhapura Clinical Society Oration 2019: Delivered at the 13th Annual Scientific Sessions of the Anuradhapura Clinical





Society on 23 rd September 2019, Anuradhapura, Sri Lanka. The title of the oration was "Detection of Cell free DNA: Changing diagnostic paradigms for tropical infections"

Professor Anjana Silva Won the Health Research Prize 2019 by the Kandy Society of Medicine

Professor Anjana Silva of the Department of Parasitology of the Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences won the Health Research Prize 2019 awarded by the Kandy Society of Medicine at the annual Foundation sessions of the society held in the Hotel Amaya Hills, Kandy on 9th August 2019. Health Research Prize is awarded annually for health researchers for their lifetime achievements in research. Upon receiving the award, Professor Silva delivered the Health Research Prize Oration 2019 titled "Combining experimental and clinical studies towards a deeper understanding of snake envenoming in humans."

Janith Warnasekara and Indika Senavirathna Received "Early Career Research Award"

Mr. Indika Senavirathna a senior lecturer of department of Biochemistry and Dr. Janith Warnasekara of department of Community Medicine(DoCM), received the International Leptospirosis Society "Early Career Research Award" in the ILS 2019 held in Vancouver, Canada.

Dr. Warnasekara presented two papers; "Microgeographical difference of leptospirosis in Sri Lanka" and "Use of Quantitative PCR to Detect Lower Level of Leptospiraemia: Improving the Sensitivity and Validity ". The latter was a paper on improving a long practiced misinterpretation of realtime polymerase chain reactions on leptospirosis diagnosis. Using experimental and clinical approaches, change of diagnosis from "not detected" to "probable" was suggested under certain conditions, changing the widely accepted "possible, probable and confirmed" case definitions for leptospirosis. Mr. Senevirathna presented a paper

titled "cytokine storm of leptospirosis". This paper established an explanation for the diversity of clinical parameters of leptospirosis patients.

These research works were components of ICIDR research project on DoCM; a collaborative project with Yale University, USA funded by National Institute of Health, USA. DoCM received five years funding for leptospirosis research from this grant.




Series of Lectures for Medical Officers Preparing for the Post Graduates

Outreach Programmes of Department of Family Medicine in 2019-2020



Department of Family Medicine have successfully conducted 27 community based clinics in 24 different locations (most are rural villages) in Anuradhapura district, in 2019. In average, 130 adults and 40 children were offered following services free of charge at each clinic.

- Health Education
- Screening for metabolic disorders (Blood glucose level, Blood pressure, Anthropometric measurements and BMI calculation)
- Screening for substance use disorders
- · Screening for depressive disorder
- Medical examination by doctors
- Counselling
- Brief intervention
- · Physiotherapy for selected conditions
- · Treatments for acute illnesses
- Referrals for specialist care and follow-up care

Community clinic programme of Department of Family Medicine conducts in collaboration with University of Sydney, Australia, University of Copenhagen, Denmark, University of Edinburgh, England, George Institute for Global Health and University of Peradeniya, Sri Lanka, as a component of 'Village alcohol education study' which is funded by Australian National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC).
