


Enhancing Governance, Management and Reform in Sri Lankan Universities through Non-Academic Staff Training (ENACT)

The four-day program discussed the trends in internationalization of higher education in the world, approaches, strategic implementation and practices at the European Universities. First day of (16th May 2022) of the training programme was related to Strategic Planning. there, trends in internationalization of higher education, and strategy of internationalization were discussed giving emphasis to importance of running an international office of a university.



On the second of the programme (17th May 2022) Mobility Management aspects were discussed while emphasizing on bilateral agreements, mobility administration, study recognition and Services, Project writing – how to prepare a successful project and the art of the project management.

On 18th May 2022, training programmes were conducted on internationalization of curriculum highlighting incorporation of an international and intercultural dimension into the content of the curriculum, international and multicultural classrooms and how to develop students' global skills, International Marketing (strategy and a position under the international office), and Intercultural competences were also discussed in detail.

On the last day of the training, it was focused on international networks and transfer of global practical exposure and there were some valuable discussions with the researchers from European Partner Universities together with research outcomes of international networks and how to select them, Staff mobility and staff training – how to recognize them in the staff development plan.

As the last activity of the programme all the trainers had the opportunity to spend open hours at the different IRO offices at different faculties of Masaryk University with experts to share the experiences.
